Part C to Part B Transition	<ul> <li>In small groups, task force members were asked to review the definitions we explored last month and the transition process. Each group reported on a priority issue:</li> <li>Group 1: Who are the representatives from Part B and Part C at a child's transition meeting? Can we identify a common denominator for all CCBs/AUs? For Part C, can the CO-Hear Coordinator serve as representatives?</li> <li>Group 2: Reflected that both Part C and Part B have clear regulatory guidance. Individual procedures are guided at the local level by MOUs. (Every CCB has an MOU with the AUs in their areas.) These MOUs vary. The role of the task force is to try to design a standardized process for children who are DHH to assure a "seamless transition" ( the wording in the law). Task force recommendations may influence who participates in the transition meeting for the AU. There was support for each family's CO-Hear Coordinator and/or EI Facilitator to participate in the transition process on behalf of the CCB.</li> </ul>	Talk about FAMILY Assessment, timelines, utilization, and opportunity for use during transition.	

	<ul> <li>Group 3: Propose professional development to clarify, for CCBs and AUs, what needs to be accomplished during the transition process.</li> <li>CCBs are responsible for planning for the transition; then AUs get involved. AU representatives have not always been familiar with issues specific to DHH.</li> <li>Some stats were spontaneously shared by CO-Hear Coordinators about their current caseloads:         <ul> <li>Arapahoe/Douglas: 42 with IFSP, 4 in process, 13 UHL</li> <li>Adams/Boulder/Broomfield: 45 with IFSP, 35 UHL</li> <li>Jefferson and Mountains: 30 with IFSP, 5 in process, 10 UHL (monitoring)</li> <li>Aurora/Denver: 48 with IFSP, 6 in process, 22 with UHL</li> </ul> </li> <li>The task force members continued to review the legal requirements for transition. When it comes to evaluation, these points were made:         <ul> <li>For children actively involved in early intervention, the evaluation must be completed and an IEP (if eligible) must be in place by the child's 3rd birthday. For children not actively involved in early intervention, the XU receives a signed consent, to complete an assessment.</li> <li>The FAMILY Assessment (Family Assessment of Multi-Disciplinary Interactional Learning for the Young Child) is available to all families. This is one option for assessment that will be discussed at a future EI Task Force meeting.</li> <li>CCBs use the Family Assessment options? AUs have responsibility for assessment - all caps)</li> <li>Might we help to identify assessment options? AUs have responsibility for assessment and determining eligibility. Are they aware of the current CCB offerings (e.g., Family Assessment)?</li> </ul> </li></ul>	
Transition Process used by Developmental Pathways (DP) CCB	<ul> <li>Beth Little and Lynn Wismann shared the transition process used by Developmental Pathways for children with bilateral hearing loss.</li> <li>DP's referral system works closely with the CO-Hear Coordinator highlighting referrals for hearing loss and making sure CO-Hear Coordinator is involved if referral is not from the CO-Hear Coordinator.</li> <li>IFSPs completed in a timely manner. Service coordinator also makes sure CO-Hear Coordinator and facilitator are involved with development of IFSP</li> </ul>	Continue discussion about DPs process at July's El Task Force meeting
	<ul> <li>Regulations specify that 2 years; 3 months is the start of the transition process (includes notifying AU)</li> </ul>	

	<ul> <li>At 2-0: Notify family about what they might want to have happen during the upcoming transition process.</li> <li>At 2-2; May have an informal discussion with family about the upcoming transition process.</li> <li>At 2-3: In an effort to have the AU ready to go (based on regulation), the transition planning starts in earnest. Attempt to have family, CO-Hear Coordinator Coordinator, Facilitator, CCB Service Coordinator, &amp; AU (as much as possible) involved.</li> <li>CO-Hear Coordinator meets with the family and facilitator to discuss transition process</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>For children with UHL, the process is a little different and is still being created (as CO-Hear Coordinator Coordinators only assumed responsibility for children with UHL in April, 2020). The process, at this time, includes:</li> <li>An assessment before a child turns 3 years old to identify any concerns families have about preschool</li> <li>A CO-Hear Coordinator meets with family</li> </ul>	
	DP has 46 service coordinators. Of the 46 service coordinators, 15 have received additional and ongoing field training from the CO-Hear Coordinator that provides them with additional information to help children with hearing and vision needs. These 15 service coordinators are considered "specialized" service coordinators. Each family is connected with the appropriate specialized service coordinator at intake and this person continues with the family through transition. The AU personnel are aware of these specialized service coordinators.
